





LETTER FROM ROB ANTHONY

At Healing Waters International, we seek to follow Christ's example of paying special attention to the most vulnerable and marginalized children, women, and men in our broken and fragmented world. To do this, we often traverse rugged terrain for long hours to come alongside beautiful but isolated communities that face complex challenges compounded by social, political, and economic injustices, not to mention the burden of recovering from frequent natural disasters.

Without basic infrastructure and resources such as water and electricity, daily activities to meet the most fundamental needs for food, water, and shelter are, for many people, all-consuming. In many regions, poorly managed growth and development compounds water contamination issues and food safety and security in their communities.

It should not be this way. It does not have to be this way. With the necessary resources, individuals and communities will embrace opportunity and apply themselves to elevate to new levels of health and flourishing. One such community is El Pajal, Guatemala.

Two years ago, the leadership council of El Pajal and their friends at The 410 Bridge reached out to Healing Waters to share their vision of establishing a safe water solution that would meet the daily needs of their entire community of 600 people and the neighboring community of Cipresales. This project was an incredibly ambitious vision due to the remote location high in western Guatemala's coffee-growing mountains that lack electricity and where treacherously steep, winding dirt roads are frequently impassable. After all, water doesn't flow uphill.

I am so thrilled to report that together, by God's grace, El Pajal now has running water in their homes - water that is purified to the highest quality standard of the WHO (and EPA) AND, water that the people love to drink because our engineers dialed in the taste profile that the community loves!

We are now in phase 2 of the project to extend the supply of safe water to neighboring Cipresales. When completed in the months ahead, this creatively engineered and appropriately sophisticated system will serve more than 550 households (3,000 individuals) with purified water, transported

over 3.5km of new pipeline, up 900m of elevation, using 100% solar power. The communities are the owners and operators of this water system, equipped with the technical, operational, and business skills necessary to supply safe water for generations successfully.

Your investment in communities like El Pajal has brought their big ideas to life, fostering a sense of perseverance and community pride. Vicki, a community council leader, expressed her gratitude on inauguration day, saying, "This is our baby that we will care for and help grow." Your contributions have made this possible, and for that, we are deeply grateful.


As we continue to prioritize regions where local teams and strategic partners serve vulnerable populations experiencing the most challenging water profiles, our work is expanding from small water kiosks serving 250-500 people to include larger-scale projects that reach 1,000 or more people in multiple communities within a region. Despite the challenges of this last-mile development, our approach is proving successful as municipalities and community development organizations seek to partner with us in these large-scale, broader-reaching projects in Haiti, Mexico, Guatemala, and Honduras - where we opened a new office this year.

We are deeply grateful for your continued partnership and support. Your prayers and generosity are a source of life to Healing Waters and the more than 430,000 men, women, and children being served daily with safe water on behalf of the living water.

Ministry Highlights from 2023

529 active projects

brought hope and health to children, mothers, and fathers in forgotten mile communities of remote regions throughout Mesoamerica, Hispaniola, and East Affrica.

6,000 new graduates

completed our biblically-based Health & Hygiene education classes.

436,000 individuals-

were served daily with safe, clean water through more than 500 active projects across 16 countries.

2.1Billion liters

of safe, clean water have been distributed to date.

At the close of the 2023 FY, 529 active community projects are serving more than 436,000 children, women, and men <u>daily</u> with safe water.

Thanks to the generous support of our donors, this number has <u>more than doubled</u> over the last 4 years and continues to grow exponentially.

In addition to addressing the urgent physical needs caused by the lack of safe water, our teams share Christ's love through practical, biblically rooted Health & Hygiene curriculum design to bring spiritual hope and reinforce healthy habits. Since 2015, more than 32,000 women, children, and men have graduated from one of our classes.

Today, more than 87,000 families are accessing safe water for drinking, handwashing, and household use.

Thanks to expanding opportunity and strategic partner growth, Healing Waters opened a new office in Western Honduras this year.


