## LETTER FROM ROB ANTHONY

This past year has been one of the most hope-filled and groundbreaking seasons in our history. Communities that once struggled under the weight of water scarcity experienced transformation, and new opportunities emerged that will shape the future of our mission for years to come.

Throughout these months, our teams showed remarkable courage and perseverance. We traveled hundreds of miles on steep and washed-out mountain roads, spent weeks away from home, braved torrential rains and rising rivers, and navigated dangerous conditions—including encounters with roving gangs. Your partnership and prayers gave us the strength to continue this work, even in the most challenging moments.

Together, we accomplished some of the most significant work in our 23-year history.

In Mexico, we completed the largest and most complex project we've ever undertaken—a multi-community safe water system built against nearly impossible odds. Today, families who once carried water long distances can turn on a tap inside their homes and receive abundant, life-giving water.

In Haiti, even as unrest and uncertainty continued to shake daily life, we remained present. We kept systems running, kept communities connected to safe water, and continued to stand alongside partners who refuse to give up.

And in rural Guatemala, we laid the groundwork for the most ambitious effort we have ever taken on. This expansive solution will soon bring lasting change to hundreds living in some of the most remote mountain regions.

This year also marked a meaningful shift in how we carry out our mission. We are expanding from solutions that meet only drinking needs toward systems that provide safe water in abundance—for drinking, bathing, cooking, cleaning, and daily life. We are working to become a model for how the developing world can access safe water sustainably, reliably, and in sufficient quantities to support households, local enterprises, and the economic activities that allow communities to thrive.

This means designing systems that endure, especially in communities that are too often last in line because their purification challenges are so difficult to meet. Our commitment is not simply to deliver safe water, but to restore it as the abundant gift God intended it to be.

For 23 years, this movement has endured because of a shared conviction and a bold, unshakable vision.

Our conviction is that the God who loves the world created water as a life-giving gift—not a source of hardship, sickness, or loss. Restoring this gift is one of the clearest expressions of Christ's love and the good news.

And our vision remains bold: that in our lifetime, we will join with others to restore God's gift of pure, abundant water to every community, every home, and every child.

Even as we look back with gratitude, we look forward with hope—knowing that the true power behind this work is God Himself, the One who is restoring His creation and drawing all people toward wholeness. We simply have the privilege of participating in His mission.

Thank you for standing with us in this movement of God—the One who gives the water of life and satisfies the deepest thirst of every soul.



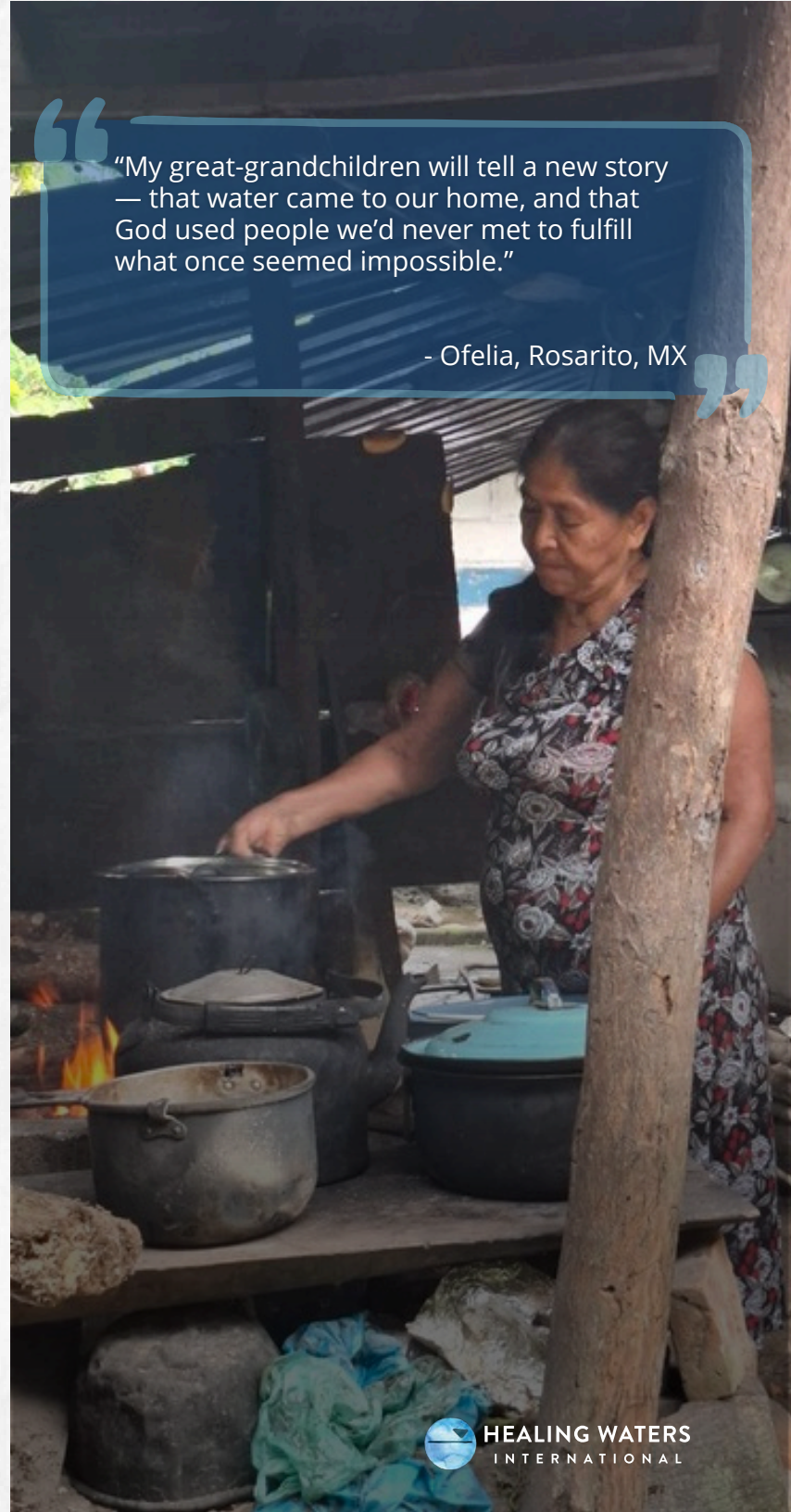

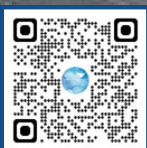
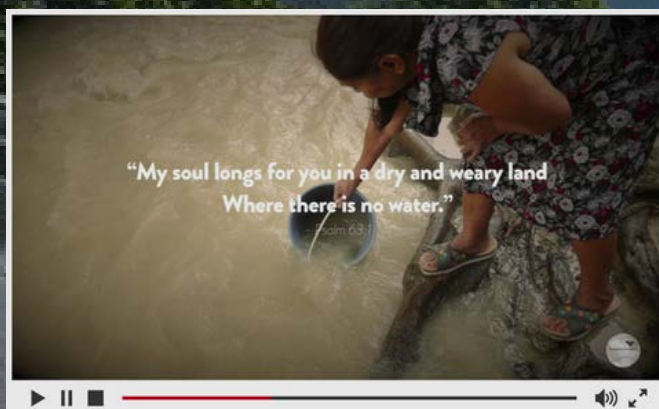

# ROSALBALI, MEXICO: A BREAKTHROUGH IN ENGINEERING AND IMPACT

In 2025, we celebrated the inauguration of one of the most ambitious safe-water projects in Healing Waters’ history. What began in early 2024 with months of careful assessment—studying Rosalballi’s terrain, water sources, infrastructure, and social dynamics—is now a comprehensive safe water enterprise engineered to suit the unique demands, harsh environment, and long-term needs of these 3 isolated communities.

The completed system showcases what our teams are capable of accomplishing in the most challenging environments: a river-based catchment system, nanofiltration powered by solar energy, and a gravity-fed distribution network that brings purified water straight to every home. For the first time ever, 219 households—nearly 1,700 people—now enjoy consistent access to safe water for drinking, cooking, bathing, and daily life.

Reaching this milestone required remarkable perseverance. The team navigated rugged terrain, a heavy monsoon season, and even the assembly of human chains involving more than 200 community members to carry materials where no roads existed. Construction teams had to adapt their work in real time to navigate large debris flows and immovable boulders, and a Starlink system was installed to maintain communication with U.S.-based engineers when all other connectivity failed.

Yet the project stands completed—strong, sustainable, and built to last for decades. Local operators are fully trained, and each household contributes to a community trust that will fund long-term maintenance. The impact is already profound: reduced illness, restored dignity, and new opportunities for education and livelihood as hours once spent collecting water are reclaimed.

Rosalballi now has what once felt impossible. And thanks to the generosity and vision of our supporters, this community will feel the ripple effects of hope and transformation for generations.

# RESTORING DIGNITY AND STRENGTH ACROSS LATIN AMERICA AND HAITI

This year, our Health and Hygiene Program continued to do far more than improve health outcomes — it restored dignity, nurtured hope, and affirmed the God-given worth of women, children, and families across Latin America and Haiti.

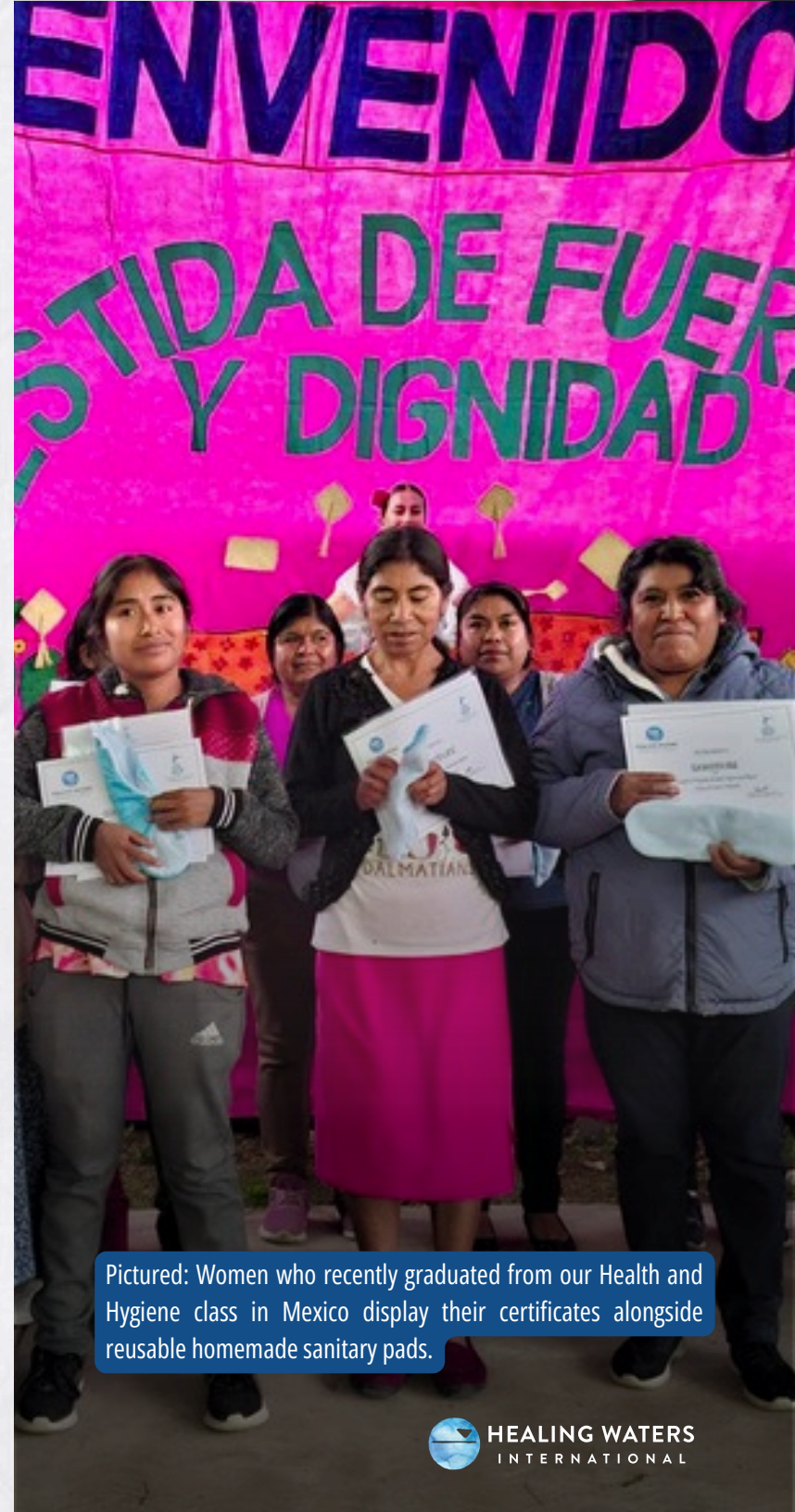
In communities where poverty weighs heavily on self-esteem, we pair safe water access with biblically grounded lessons that remind participants of their inherent value. These gatherings have become safe, supportive spaces where women can learn, share freely, and rediscover joy. As one woman in Mexico told us, “I never knew the Bible said such beautiful things about women. Now I know God sees me as a flower — the most beautiful in His garden.”

Across Mexico, Guatemala, and Haiti, we’re seeing more than improved hygiene and healthier households — we’re witnessing renewed confidence, stronger relationships, and communities rising into their God-given potential. Through every lesson taught and every home equipped with safe water, families are experiencing lasting change rooted in dignity, identity, and hope.

Since 2021, Haiti has faced overlapping crises — from natural disasters to economic collapse and violent political unrest. Much of Port-au-Prince is now controlled by gangs, with other regions affected as well.

In 2025, over 1.3 million people were internally displaced in Haiti, the highest number of displacements in the world due to crime. Reports are that as many as 50% of nonprofit organizations and missionaries have left Haiti since 2018 because of the instability, lack of security, corruption, and gang violence.

Yet even in crisis, God's work can't be stopped. Our local team followed Jesus into places of desperate need with resilience, innovation, and faith — equipping the local church to provide practical support for vulnerable children and families through our longstanding partnerships with Compassion International, Living Water International, and Food for the Poor.

# TRANSFORMATIVE IMPACT

## 764 communities

in remote regions throughout Latin America, the Caribbean, and East Africa, have experienced renewed hope and health through abundant access to safe water.

In FY25, 7 new community projects were constructed in Haiti (5) and Latin America (2) - including our largest project to date in Rosabali Mexico. In addition, 11 custom purification systems were deployed to water franchises in East Africa through our partnership with Jibu.

## 578,823 individuals

have been served with the gift of safe water given in the name of Jesus.

To date, 764 community water projects have provided safe water to serve the daily needs of more than 578,000 children, women, and men.

## 115,000 families

have experienced the transformative impacts of safe water.

More than 115,000 families have gained access to safe water for drinking, handwashing, and household use through Healing Waters projects.

## 45,000 participants

have been reached with Gospel-filled messages through our biblically-based Health & Hygiene education program, leading many to a first-time or deepened faith in Christ.

Our teams share Christ's love through practical, biblically rooted Health & Hygiene curriculum design to bring spiritual hope and reinforce healthy habits. Since 2015, our health & hygiene programs have reached more than 45,000 women, children, and men.

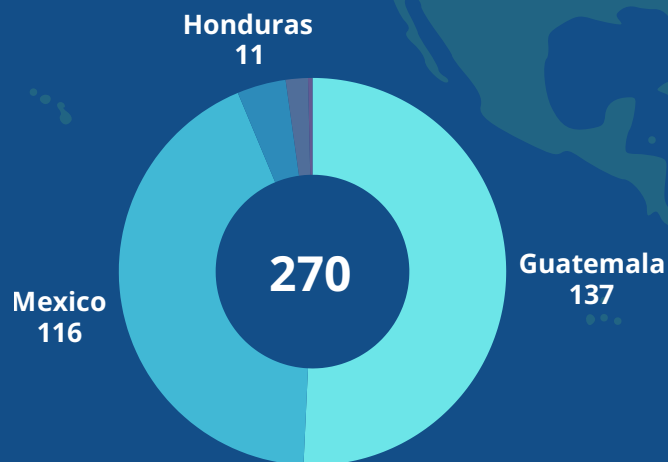


# GLOBAL REACH LOCAL IMPACT

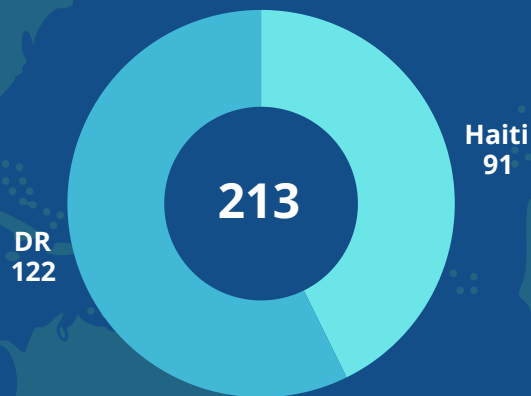
To date, **764 community water projects** have provided safe water to serve the daily needs of more than **578,000 children, women, and men.**

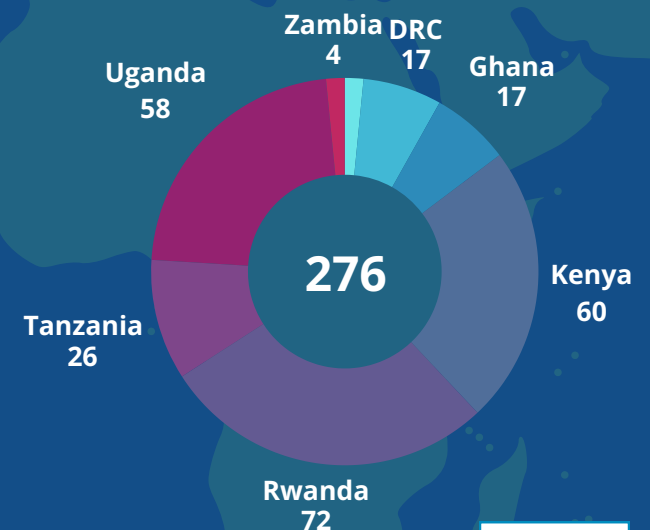

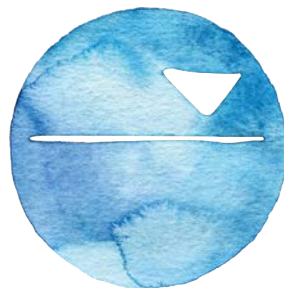
## JUST GOOD ENOUGH IS NOT ENOUGH
